

Thomas previously completed a Certificate III in Light Vehicle Mechanical Technology. He was ready to hit the ground running by taking on a second trade through the Prelude to the Future Program 5. Asbuild NT have been taking on apprentices since commencement of operation in 2008, and have partnered with GTNT Group in 2012 to provide additional support and expertise to Asbuild's apprentices and currently have six active apprentices. Asbuild NT have welcomed many work experience students throughout the years, and recently offered a student an apprenticeship from his participation in work placement. Asbuild continues to support Territorians to grow in the construction industry and encourage people to work in this trade. Company directors, Paul and Nadine, are strong supporters of upskilling and training all of their staff.

GEBIE CIVIL & CONSTRUCTION

The board of GCC, whose membership is made up predominantly of Traditional Owners, have a commitment to support the long-term strategy to provide ongoing training and employment of the traditional owners of the Groote Eylandt Archipelago. These initiatives ensure that the Traditional Owners of Groote Eylandt have developed the skills and qualifications needed to gain full time employment, and to ensure numerous pathways available for the younger members of the community. GCC currently has five Indigenous Apprentices and six Indigenous Trainees employed on a full-time basis. They have a dedicated Indigenous Program Manager and three Indigenous Program Mentors who work alongside the local employees.

TERRITORY GENERATION

Territory Generation actively contributes to developing the skills of Northern Territory residents by hosting apprentices and upskilling their own employees with dual-trade apprenticeships. Territory Generation has approximately 80 trades qualified employees across all sites. These employees are either in trade-based roles or have upskilled into operator positions. They are committed to create a supportive workplace that provide opportunities for apprentices to nurture their interests and aptitudes in within their trade. Territory Generation have female apprentices who have recently become members of the NAWIC NT Committee and encourages them to be active members and female representatives in the industry.

DARREN WRIGHT

Host Business: Power and Water Corporation

Darren is a qualified plumber, and light vehicle mechanic which he completed before starting his time at Power and Water. The foundation of his solid leadership style and hands-on teaching method is based on his time working on the plant, his effort in monitoring and maintaining it, and his prior experience as a tradesman. Darren also partakes in in-house leadership and cross-cultural training to further improve himself and his understanding of leadership, culture in the workplace, and communication. His trainees feel grateful to be mentored by him.

PAUL HEWITT

Paul has supervised 50+ apprentices over the span of his career. He is currently the Electrical Lead at the Channel Island Power Station.
